SCRIPTURE One Body with Many Members (NRSV)

Reader 1:

This wisdom comes to us from 1 Corinthians, chapter 12, verses 12 to 19, and verse 26.

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body....and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear would say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body...If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honoured, all rejoice together with it.

LIVING TRADITION

Reader 2:

This wisdom comes to us from Pope Francis in his 2020 address for the *International Day of People with Disability*.

Creating a fully accessible parish requires not only the removal of architectural barriers, but above all, helping parishioners to develop attitudes and acts of solidarity and service towards persons with disabilities and their families. Our aim should be to speak no longer about "them", but rather about "us".

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE (Adapted from Nancy Eiesland's *Encountering the Disabled God*, 2007).

We pray to the Lord.

All: God of mercy, hear our prayer.

Reader: For those who suffer from degradation and marginalisation because of their

disability, especially through COVID-19: that they find welcoming places of safety

and communities of hope where they can renew their lives and spirits.

We pray to the Lord.

All: God of mercy, hear our prayer.

Reader: For people with disability in our local communities: that their voices are heard,

their experiences honoured, and their gifts allowed to flourish. We pray to the Lord.

All: God of mercy, hear our prayer.

Reader: For all of us here: that we be united as the Body of Christ, as Christ is united with us

in the Eucharist. We pray to the Lord.

All: God of mercy, hear our prayer.

Reader: Are there any other prayers today?

Leader: Lord Jesus, you are blest, broken, and shared for the world.

May we also be a living sign of your grace in our world today.

CLOSING PRAYER
